## Clearing Selected Populations

Clearing a selected population is a feature allowing the user to delete multiple populations at once. The feature is located under the Reporting tab, Reporting Utilities and Clear Populations.

To clear more than one population or groups of populations:

1. The user may either search for a particular population to delete or scroll through the list of populations. Note: The user may change their view to see up to 1,000 populations at a time.
2. Enter a check beside the population labels(s) to delete. The labels will turn from black to blue, highlighting the labels for an easy manual review.
3. Click Delete Labels.
4. A message will pop up asking to confirm the deletion of the selected populations. Click YES to delete. Otherwise, click cancel.
